

The DfE Performance Tables (2019) say the school was in the Top 10% of schools for Y11 exam results.

#### WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

The new Performance Tables (2022) should come out in November.



These grades are a great guide to you in terms of where your child is heading.

They are based on the expectations the government have of your child.

They stem from the Y6 SATs results your child got and say what your child should (statistically) get by the end of Year 11.

Of course, though a guide, they are flawed.

We had one girl who we know messed up on her English / Reading SAT - she finished over 29 grades better than the government expected.

We had one girl born in August - she was bound to get lower SATs - and she ended up over 30 grades better than the government expected.

They are not a limit - but they are higher than expected - they are aspirational. Go get' em...

Your child needs 4s in English and Maths to avoid a retake... Lower-level apprenticeship... Higher college course...

They need 6s at least to get on an A-Level - which would suggest a A\*/A/B/C/D/E...

They will get target grades / predicted grades in Sixth Form which will go off to universities / employers - they will use them to decide if your child gets a place...



#### So...

- Talk to your child about these grades...
- Talk them up in every subject... Incentivise...
- Talk to us if they need help we'll bend over backwards...
- Check the reports (EduLink) that come out at the end of every term and see where they are...
- Talk to them about where they want to go and so what they need to do...

A big part of my Summer 2024 - and yours - will be Exam Results Day...

This will not be your child's day - it will be the family's too...

They'll get their brown envelope and there will be a collective holding of breath...

In 2019 - the last time there were proper exams - your school as the best in Staffordshire.

This Summer we did far better than then. We're looking forward to later this term to see what it means nationally - but it will be great

Your child's Year group is just the same in terms of ability - just as strong. There is no reason why we can't get them doing brilliantly.

On average each child got 6-7 grades higher than what the government expected.

If we work together then they'll do the same.



#### The Now & The Then

So what does a Top 10% school mean...

168/205 got a 4+ in English & Maths... so 37 did not...

192/205 got a 4+ in English... so 13 did not...

172 got a 4+ in Maths... so 33 did not...

24.9% got 7+ in English and Maths!!!...

156/205 got better than what the government expected !!!

Most did brilliantly - a few did poorly - but we knew who they were well before the exams...

If you do poorly here life or approach has gone against you...



Keeping the positive dialogue going at home is a massive factor...

# Timings...

English, Maths & Science get 8 lessons per fortnight.

French, Geography & History usually get 5 per fortnight.

The rest get 4 per fortnight...

ICT and PE are 1 lesson per week...

The week is less varied as it is just those Pathway choices - but it has more of what they like...

#### Classmates...

Your child has spent 3 years with X-Half or Y-Half...

This meant they only met half the Year group...This disappears in Year 10 - now they meet everyone...

They may not have friends in their class - they need to get on with this...

They are never more than 2hrs away from a break... And all classes have seating plans...



And note their classes will likely change in Year 11 too!

#### Teachers....

There is no guarantee they will have the same teacher next year...

Do not expect continuity... Even if the teacher is still at the school...

There are lots from reasons why we move teachers around...

What works for the school one year, doesn't necessarily work the next year...

Out goal is always the best provision for every child - not the preference of one...



#### Class Sizes...

Your child may have class sizes of 50...

This may sound counter-productive - it is not...

Maths (Sets 2 & 3)... Science (Sets 2 & 3)... French (Higher Paper)...

This approach has already reaped huge rewards - this is why we have rolled it out each year...

#### Work & Workload

GCSEs are a step up and the level and quantity of work can be a challenges.

We work hard to balance it and steer your child through - but at times they will get overloaded...

Talk to us - tell us - we can re-jig...

Please don't leap to promises that are unhelpful, unrealistic or detrimental...

If we work it out together we work it out better...

The main exam period is 4 weeks.

Vocational exams are usually now done just before the main exam period - so pass them first time!

# Saturday & Holiday Schools

There will be increasing Saturday Schools tied to exams - so they will increase over time.

They usually run between 9.30am-12.00am - set times and subjects will be published in advanced.

They are optional - unless we tell a student to come.

They are tied to specific subjects.

They are non-school uniform and are free.




#### **Revision Guides**

Information will be circulated on these and some will then appear on Parent Pay where you can get them at set times.

#### **Exam Concessions**

Your child may get checked for exam concessions - but to ensure we test as many children as we need you may not be told in advance.

These are standard tests to see if a child qualifies for extra time in exams, etc. It could be for reasoning speed, processing, etc.

It is nothing to worry about - if support is available then we will let you know.



#### Wider Life

There is more in my later session but I wanted to stress it is not all exams, exams, exams...
