### TOP TIPS

- Spend 1 minute per mark! A part (a) question worth 2 marks should not take you more than 2 minutes.
- If you think you will run out of time, complete the part (d)
  questions first.
- Positive marking! The examiner will try to give you marks wherever possible and will never deduct marks if you have got an answer wrong.
- Do not leave an answer blank. If you are stuck use your common sense and put something down, you never know you might get it right!
- Use teachings and quotes to support your answers. You can still get the marks if you don't get the quote word for word.
- Use examples where possible to show a deeper understanding.
- Always explain how a belief or teaching affects/impacts the life of a believer. Failure to do this will limit you to low grades.
- Part (a): 2 marks, defining a key term / concept, always give an example
- Part (b): 5 marks, will always be "describe", 1 PEED paragraph
- Part (c): 8 marks, will always be "explain", 2 PEED paragraphs, if it asks for 2 religious views you must give two views.
- Part (d): 15 marks, will always be "discuss", need to form a
  judgement and show evaluation, make sure you discuss a variety of
  views, explain which of your arguments are the strongest or
  weakest, link your opinion to religious views and the question.
   Remember this is your chance to show the examiner everything you
  know.
